2012 has already been a year of numerous positive changes at the Kankakee Nursery.

In early July we launched our new website which we are very proud of and excited about sharing with you. We feel that it is very customer friendly and offers many improvements from the previous site. First, information relating to plant characteristics is much more abundant. Photo availability has greatly increased, with new ones being added daily. Search ability is also much improved. It is now much easier to find the specific item you are looking for due to an enhanced ability to search by distinct traits of the plant you are interested in. Finally, online plant availability is updated constantly to ensure better accuracy, and the on-line ordering process has been streamlined.

A record 43 new plant varieties have been added to production this year, with additional varieties being evaluated on an ongoing basis. We look at new plants from multiple entities. Our experienced team selects only those plants that prove to be either superior to an existing variety or those that offer our customer desirable traits while still meeting our strict criteria in terms of hardiness, disease resistance, etc. You can view these new varieties on pages 8 & 9 of this catalog.

Production of our new line of container grown native trees is also now in full swing. By growing these trees in a #10-gallon container, we feel that we can offer a line of substantial trees with a high quality root system for improved survivability. Most of these trees will be available in the summer of 2013. A list of new container tree varieties in production can be found on pages 8 of this catalog.

Despite the pressures of a weak economy, we have once again expanded our B&B tree production this past spring, with plans to do so again in the spring of 2013 and beyond. By doing so, we feel we are positioning ourselves well for future demand. Our field staff has been doing an excellent job of maintaining our fields and the quality of our stock. Those customers who have visited the nursery this year invariably remark as to how well the nursery looks. We hope that you will find the opportunity to come to the nursery and see for yourself. You are welcome to tour our facilities at any time. We would be delighted to show you around!



# **TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SALE**

All prices in this catalog are quoted FOB Aroma Park, Illinois.

- Usual trade terms to customers with established credit
- All others: 25% cash with order, balance COD
- Visa, MasterCard, and Discover accepted on pick-up orders
- 2% discount if paid on or before 10 days, net due thereafter. Discount does not apply to credit card or debit card purchases.
- Interest is charged on past-due accounts A finance charge of 1.5% per month (annual interest rate 18%) is applied to invoices unpaid at the end of the month following the month in which the invoice is due.

#### TAGGING

Tagging stock in the field is subject to the approval of management. A charge of 10% will be added to the cost of items tagged for spring digging.

## HOLDING CHARGES

Please pick up plant material when ready. A holding charge to be determined by Kankakee Nursery Co. may be assessed to orders not picked up promptly. Additionally, orders not picked up in a timely fashion may be placed back in inventory and sold.

#### SHIPPING

Please give shipping instructions and route. If no instructions are given, we will forward to the best of our judgment without assuming responsibility. All goods travel at the purchaser's risk and expense.

#### TRUCK DELIVERY

We offer truck service to any part of the United States or Canada. A minimum order of \$1,000 is necessary for this service. See chart on page 5 for shipping rates.

### CLAIMS

We shall not entertain claims for any cause after goods have been accepted or when a report is not made in writing within 10 days after arrival of stock.

#### SUMMER DIGGING

A 15% charge will be added to the price of all summer-dug trees. We assume no responsibility for plants purchased for out-of-season digging.

#### **GUARANTEE**

If any nursery stock proves untrue to the description or variety name under which it is sold, Kankakee Nursery will, with proper proof, replace such nursery stock or refund the original amount paid. We shall in no case be liable for any sum greater than the amount originally paid for said nursery stock.

Green foliage with red tips by midsummer turning deep burgundy in fall; easily mistaken for Japanese Blood Grass. Grows 2' to 3' high with a 2' spread. Prefers moist fertile soil, but is drought tolerant.


